### **Worldview: Rooted in Christ**

#### **Recommendation for Success**

The elders at Agros recommend that any member attending should bring paper and pen and take notes to get the most out of Sunday School, as a lot of material will be covered each week. #### **Definitions**

Worldview: A network of presuppositions, unable to be tested by natural science, and is the light by which all experience is interpreted. Includes Metaphysics, Epistemology, and Ethics.

Metaphysics: How we examine the ultimate nature of reality. Abstract rules of governance.

Epistemology: How we know things

Ethics: A set of moral principles

#### **Top 5 Takeaways: The Goal for Worldview**

1. Do not walk as the world walks (Eph. 4:17-24)
2. Destroy arguments and lofty opinions raised against God (2 Cor. 10:5)
3. Disallow people from deluding you with worldly knowledge (Col. 2:1-4)
4. To be rooted in Christ, as you were taught (Col. 2:5-10)
5. To honor Christ in apologetics (1 Pet. 3:15)

#### **Summary**

Everybody has a worldview that they use to interpret their experience. This worldview is not neutral. This Sunday School series, "Worldview: Rooted in Christ", aims to equip the church with a Biblical worldview, to be rooted in Christ, as they were taught (Col. 2:4-10). Paul clearly shows that the church was taught a worldview, one founded in Christ, who in Him are stored all treasures of wisdom and knowledge. We aim to do just that in this series.

The goal of this first Sunday School class is to give a reason for why we are studying this topic, and why it should be taught at church. The Top 5 Takeaways listed above detail our reasoning from scripture. Paul lays out a clear case that all wisdom and knowledge can only be found in Christ (Col. 2; Proverbs 1:7), and that we use this wisdom and knowledge to make foolish the wisdom of the world (Col. 2; 2 Cor. 10:5) and stand firm in our faith (Col. 2).
